Accommodation

Is there a pick-up service provided upon arrival?	There is airport pickup at a designated window of time. Students will receive information by e-mail to sign up. Students can also take a quick cab/Uber ride from airport to campus.
How can exchange students apply for accommodation?	After acceptance, students will receive information on applying for accommodations. Students must pay the \$250 deposit to reserve their housing. On-campus housing is required and guaranteed. More information at http://utulsa.edu/campus-life/housing-dining/
Cost of accommodation	About \$4,300 per semester
Is there a kitchen facility available in the student accommodation? (or a meal plan)	Student Dormitories – cooking facilities are available; a meal plan for eating in the cafeteria is available and may be required for some students. Student Apartment – cooking facilities are available in each apartment; the meal plan is optional.

Financial matters for exchange students

Are there any required fees to be paid by students? (ex: Student Union Fee)	\$250 housing deposit; Health insurance, approx. \$1000 per semester. Most students can also expect to purchase textbooks for their courses. The University is providing access to online textbooks at no cost to exchange students.

Employment

Are there employment opportunities for exchange students?	Yes – On-campus only – up to 20 hours per week
Internship opportunities for exchange students?	Yes. Volunteer opportunities too.
If there are employment opportunities, what are the employment regulations and procedures?	Students must seek permission from our SEVIS Compliance Officer (immigration) for any employment. Students may seek employment (J-1 academic training) after their study program has finished.

VISA Procedures and assistance

After receipt of the Acceptance/Welcome packet (which will include the DS-2019 immigration document & instructions), students will need to apply and pay for the **J-1 Visa for Exchange Visitors** at the nearest U.S. Embassy/Consulate in their country of residence. Please pay close attention to immigration requirements and regulations to maintain student status while in the U.S. Follow all instructions and complete forms accurately.
